Warisan & Wahyu Symposium 2026

General Information

1. What is Warisan & Wahyu Symposium 2026?

Warisan & Wahyu Symposium 2026 is a half-day educational symposium that explores discussions surrounding Traditional Malay Medicine, Thibbun Nabawi and holistic wellbeing within the context of modern society. The symposium aims to provide a balanced, professional and community-oriented platform for learning, dialogue and reflection.

2. What is the purpose of this symposium?

The symposium is organised to encourage responsible and meaningful conversations surrounding:

- traditional Malay wellness practices
- holistic wellbeing
- family and community wellness
- Thibbun Nabawi
- modern wellness challenges
- heritage and contemporary realities

The event seeks to bridge heritage, knowledge and modern perspectives through a structured and educational platform.

3. Is this a religious seminar or a medical conference?

The symposium is educational and discussion-based in nature. It is not intended to function as a formal medical conference nor as a religious sermon series. Discussions may touch on wellness, heritage and holistic wellbeing from cultural, educational and contemporary perspectives.
